





Caleb Hudson is the newest member of the Canadian Brass, having graduated from the Juilliard School with both a Bachelor and Master of Music degree. Acclaimed by the New York Times as 'brilliantly stylish," Caleb made his solo debut with the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center,

performing Bach's Brandenburg Concerto No. 2.

Caleb has performed as a soloist around the world, most recently with the Israel Philharmonic in Tel Aviv. Possessing a wide range of musical styles, his experience ranges from soloing in Carnegie Hall to appearing with rock band Vampire Weekend on Jimmy Kimmel Live. Other recent solo engagements include the Santa Fe Chamber Music Festival, Yellow Barn Festival, University of Georgia Wind Ensemble, University of Scranton, and a solo recital at the University of Georgia that was broadcast nationally on NPR's *Performance Today*.

Caleb won first place at the National Trumpet
Competition multiple times, and performed with
pianist Vladimir Feltsman at the Aspen Music Festival,
as well as the New York City Ballet, New World
Symphony, Jupiter Symphony Chamber Players, and
New York Trumpet Ensemble. An avid baroque
musician, Caleb also performs with notable early
music ensembles including Philharmonia Baroque,
American Bach Soloists, The American Classical
Orchestra, Concert Royal, and the Trinity Baroque
Orchestra. He is an alumnus of Interlochen Arts
Academy and Ensemble ACJW, a fellowship program
of Carnegie Hall that promotes arts advocacy,
community outreach, and music education.

As part of an exclusive agreement between the Conn-Selmer Corporation and Canadian Brass, Caleb performs on 24-karat gold-plated Bach trumpets.

A native of N.J., Dr. Joel Bacon holds degrees in mathematics and organ performance from Baylor University in Waco, Texas, where he was a student of Joyce Jones, and an artist diploma in organ from the Konservatorium der Stadt Wien (Vienna, Austria), where he studied with Michael Gailit. With a



dissertation on the use of organ in selected orchestral works, he earned his PhD in historical musicology through a joint degree program of Vienna's University of Music and Performing Arts and the University of Vienna.

Joel Bacon has a growing reputation as a performer, teacher and scholar in North America and Europe. He has been heard in recital in Germany, Austria, France, Switzerland, Canada, and the US, and live performances have been broadcast on Austrian Radio (1) and Public Radio International. He has taught at the prestigious Oundle International Festival (Cambridge, UK), at several Pipe Organ Encounters of the American Guild of Organists, and at other courses in the US and Canada. With the principal violist of the Munich Philharmonic, Albrecht Rohde, he has recorded a CD of music for viola and organ.

Joel Bacon currently holds the Stewart and Sheron Golden Chair in Organ and Liturgical Studies, the first endowed chair in the College of Liberal Arts. Before coming to CSU, he was assistant organist of St. Thomas Lutheran Church, Munich-Grnwald, and served as frequent guest organist at the former Hapsburg imperial church, St. Augustine, Vienna.

A free-will offering will be taken to support Father Ubald's mission of peace.

Father Ubald has been a Roman Catholic priest for 25 years in the Cyangugu Diocese of southeastern Rwanda. During the 1994 genocide, Father Ubald lost over 80 members of his family and over 45,000 of his parishioners were exterminated. He escaped through the Congo on foot in the middle of the night. When he left Rwanda, he made a promise to his Bishop that he would return to bring healing to his people. He spent 3 months in Belgium during the genocide at which time he said that he cried every day. After a trip to Lourdes where he heard Jesus tell him, "Ubald, carry your cross," he felt a release from the burden of his sorrows and knew he was called to preach healing, forgiveness, and reconciliation. He and the murderer of his family reconciled and Father Ubald paid for the education of the man's children. Over 300 such reconciliations have been achieved at his Center for the Secret of Peace in Rwanda.

The Government of Rwanda seeks him out for advice on forgiveness and reconciliation as the country continues to rebuild after the devastation of the genocide. He continues to preach healing, forgiveness and reconciliation in Rwanda, the Congo, and Burundi. He has also traveled all over Europe, the Holy Land, and other parts of Africa. He made his first trip to the United States in 2009, at the request of Immaculee' Ilibagiza, author of "Left To Tell," another genocide survivor, who currently resides in the U.S.

Each year United Methodists celebrate peacemaking efforts by observing Peace with Justice Sunday. The offering received on this Special Sunday supports ministries that teach and advocate for principles of peace and justice around the world. As disciples of Christ, we are called to love our enemies, seek justice, and serve as reconcilers of conflict.

We know the presence of political and social turmoil can be caused by a number of issues including economic disparity, environmental degradation, gender and racial inequality, xenophobia, illness and disease. If we want peace, we must be committed to disrupting conditions and systems that perpetuate injustice as well as working for just, equitable and durable solutions to the root causes of conflict.

Peace with Justice ministries/activities can be large or small and are extremely varied, including work with refugee resettlement, border town/immigration issues, intolerance and aggression, racism and xenophobia, classism, ageism, and gender discrimination. These ministries may be carried out by local churches, districts, annual and central conferences, interfaith and ecumenical bodies, secular organizations and World Council of Churches.

Grant requests for such ministries are made through the annual conferences. Our Rocky Mountain Conference <u>Peace with Justice Coordinators</u> are Laurie Day and Pat Johnson.*




