

Message from Melanie, Lead Pastor...

don't know exactly when the religious faith of my childhood and youth became the faith of my adulthood. It was a long journey of doubting and questioning the faith in which I was raised, after a season of loss. I essentially outgrew it. I began to doubt if God was a personal God who actually cared about creation. Besides, I had seen too much hypocrisy and inconsistency in the lives of those who claimed



to follow Jesus. I had seen too much suffering in the world to believe God could do anything about it, or worse, chose not to.

And yet the persistency of belief would not leave me alone. I tried to walk away but found myself coming back to a God revealed in vulnerability and gentleness who cared about suffering humanity. I found a God who actually identified with all creatures and all creation, a God who understands this mysterious human experience. I tried to leave, but this faith never really left me. It was a sojourn that eventually allowed me to see the faith again as if for the first time. I came to understand that there is indeed a timeless truth, beauty, and liberation in the way of Jesus Christ.

My own journey back to faith did not happen in isolation. It was inspired and nurtured by spiritually mature Christians who lived what they believed. People who were more concerned with right relationships than the purity of dogma, who took an interest in my life while inviting me into theirs. It was inspired by a church that was spiritually vibrant and missionally engaged.

Many of us are working hard to help our church become a place filled with spiritually mature Christians eager to serve God and neighbor. I want to invite you to take another step in your faith journey this Fall, so that we can become just such a church. The Path is a journey of deepening your connection with God and others. This experience will help you align your everyday life with practices of spiritual attentiveness and growth. 
