History of the First Church Library

The origins of the library at First Church are not well documented, but our first library may well have been in the College Avenue building.

At Stover Street, the library was first located in the administrative hallway along one wall of the original parlor. The 1960s were a boom time for church libraries nationwide and when the building was renovated and the current Parlor added, the library was given its current home along the main corridor between the south entrance and the Sanctuary.

Charlotte Allum, a pioneer supporter of the library, credits Shirley DeWitt and Bob DeWitt, who was a CSU librarian, with establishing the first card catalog. With a home at Stover and Pitkin, the DeWitts spent much of their spare time at the library. Princetta Rutter, a current member, worked untold hours typing the cards.

Library holdings were boxed up in the basement and awaiting the new, highly visible space when the church experienced a flood. When she heard about the flood, Charlotte headed straight for the church to check on the boxes of books. When she opened one, the red dye on the cover of a *Jerusalem Bible* came pouring out and covered her arm. But the *Books of Discipline*, which were a point of pride for the library, were unharmed.

When the church offered its space to the Har Shalom community before the construction of their synagogue, members of the Jewish congregation donated numerous books to First Church's library.

Other early major contributors included Pam and Rich Raab and Eleanor Hoag.

FINDING GRACE; Stories Lived; Lessons Learned

People in any stage of bereavement are encouraged to attend the presentation by Fort Collins author and speaker Jane Nicolet titled, "Finding Grace: Stories Lived; Lessons Learned" at 1:30 p.m. Sept. 10 in the Parlor.

"I welcome anybody who feels they are journeying in some kind of grief," said Nicolet. "If you think you are in grief, you are in grief. It is an emotional ride."

The free, interactive presentation includes a packet of materials that will help individuals discern where they are on the pathways of grief and explore the meanings of grief, grace, morning and healing.

"I look at it as if we are storytellers and we're telling our story today," said Nicolet.

Nicolet has written two books on the subject: *Finding Grace: Journeys of Grief, Courage and Healing* and *Letters for Grace: One Mother's Journey*. The latter recounts the 10-year bereavement journey of the author after the death of her son, Matthew. Both books will be available for purchase at the presentation, which is sponsored by Adult Faith Formation and the Grief Group at First Church.

CROP Walk for Hunger **Communities Responding to Overcome Poverty** **Sunday October 6th - 1:00 p.m.**



Join other community participants in a 5K (3.2 mile) walk around Fort Collins to raise money to combat hunger & poverty here and around the world. Walkers gather sponsors (non-walkers) to support their walk and $\frac{1}{4}$ of the donations go directly to support local programs at the Food Bank for Larimer County, and $\frac{3}{4}$ goes to Church World Service (which the United Methodist Church is a member). Church World Service uses the donations in efforts to eradicate hunger and poverty in the United States and around the world through emergency and disaster relief, as well as, education and resource programs.

Cans Around the Oval - All Church Food Drive


First Church is participating in Colorado State University's **Cans Around the Oval** campaign to benefit the Food Bank for Larimer County. The drive begins Monday September 9, and Collection Day at CSU (the Oval) is Wednesday October, 16.

Cans around the Oval 2018 raised **35,456 lbs. of food** and **\$61,459!!** That translates to a total impact of **\$307,395 of food** collected.

Although it looks and sounds good to give **cans of food**, it is even better to give \$\$\$\$. For every \$ donated, the Food Bank is able to purchase \$5 worth of food. It also allows the Food Bank to provide fresh dairy, fruit & vegetables to its program recipients. Make checks out to FUMC, write Food Bank on the memo line, and First Church will write one big check to the Food Bank to be presented to CSU on Collection Day.

The drive is sponsored by our youth and the Community & World Missions Committee. Collection barrels will be placed conveniently at the East & South entrances and in the Fellowship Hall.


