



Copies of the book will be available for \$11 at the event. For those unable to attend, limited number of copies will be available at the Adult Faith Formation table on Sundays.



3rd graders! We will be presenting you a Bible of your very own at Children's Sabbath on October 10th at the 9:30 a.m. service. Look for more details to come.


