

MESSAGE FROM MELANIE

wanted to update you on the latest from the denomination. A group of theologically conservative United Methodists will launch a new worldwide church on May 1, called the Global Methodist Church. They are fed up with inclusive churches like ours continuing to defy the ban on same gender marriage and the ordination and acceptance of openly gay children of God. General Conference, originally scheduled for 2020, was delayed until 2024, and they could not wait that long to break away. I frankly consider this a good thing, so that we can have the inevitable divorce and make sure that loving, inclusive churches like ours will continue to flourish.

While all of this embarrassing institutional drama unfolds, ministry goes on. Pandemics, inflation, economic inequality, discrimination, authoritarian regimes, and atrocities of war have a way of putting into perspective our denominational struggles. It's not that the contentious and deeply divisive issues of our time are not important. They matter deeply, and we all must fight for justice and inclusion. Jesus always made room for the overlooked person right in front of him, particularly the most marginalized, demonized and neglected people of his time. We are called to do the same.

There is a grace-filled, loving and open Methodism which I dearly cherish. In fact, I have devoted 40 years of my professional life to this grace driven movement. I never would have invested so much time, energy, love, and labor into an organization without some form of an inclusive and promising future. We will live into that God inspired future, not a narrow, exclusive, and short-sighted future.

To be honest, I do not care nearly as much about what the denomination does as I care about what I do to be a faithful follower of Jesus Christ. I want to use this precious life I have been given to bless, heal, and make a positive difference in this weary world, which in the words of Tolstoy "...is soaked with the tears and blood of the innocent." I want to be a force of goodness and love, and I know First Church will be just such a force, no matter what the UMC does or does not do in the years to come.


