#### **WORSHIP FLOWERS- CHANGE IN PRICE AND PROCEDURE**

In order to provide the most attractive flower arrangements for worship at the best cost and value, the following changes will go into effect beginning September 9:

- 1) The cost will increase to \$50 per week a long overdue increase.
- 2) First Church will supply our florist for all arrangements. Arrangements from other florists or from home will no longer be accepted.


