CANS AROUND THE OVAL: FUMC has joined CSU's annual drive to support the Food Bank of Larimer County. Collection Day at CSU (at the Oval) is Wednesday, October 16. If you missed the deadline, we do collect for the Food Bank year-round with a collection bin in Mission Corner. Thank you for you support of this wonderful mission in our community.

Cherry production in Larimer County grew significantly in the first years of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, increasing to **10,000 acres** (155,000 trees) by **1945.** The fruit was shipped to commercial bakeries in the east. Remnants of former orchards are found west of Loveland near Devil's Backbone, and to the north of Old Town, east of Terry Lake, and south of Wellington. In Water's Way Park (southeast Fort Collins), a plaque commemorates the 60-year history of this highly successful industry.
