MUSIC IN WORSHIP TODAY

The music chosen for worship today includes two pieces of choral music in recognition of Black History Month. The first, "Soon-ah Will Be Done" comes from the genre of Negro Spirituals. The original tune and text were sung by slaves in the deep south in hope of a better day to come. The second is a selection of African American gospel music. Although written in the style reminiscent of a spiritual, it does not date back to the time of slavery, and thus is not truly a Negro Spiritual. No less powerful, it tells a more recent story of suffering, injustice, and racism inflicted upon the African American population. *City Called Heaven* was premiered by the All-City Youth Chorus of the Chicago Public Schools under the direction of the composer, Josephine Poelinitz. She later composed the arrangement we are singing today.
