The joy that came from singing *Didn't My Lord Deliver* Daniel for the enslaved people who first sang it was the theme of God's greatness, the promise of hope found in God, and the possibility of spiritual deliverance. This promise of God's love and grace still rings true for all oppressed peoples today.



It is an ancient custom in the Christian church that "alleluia" not be sung from Ash Wednesday until Easter, symbolizing our voluntary restraint of praise during the penitential season of Lent. With the singing of Farewell to Alleluia we sing the last "alleluia" that will be sung until Easter at FUMC.
