

Nurse Notes

One of the concerns <u>health.gov</u> is raising awareness of in March is colorectal cancer. It's all over the news recently (*NBC's The Today Show, ABC's Good Morning America, and CNN News*), that there

has been a substantial rise in the number of cases of colorectal cancer in adults under the age of 55. What can you do? 1. Know your risks. Ask about your family history. 2. Do your homework. Read up on colorectal cancer on reputable websites like the American Cancer Society (<u>cancer.org</u>), or the Mayo Clinic (<u>mayoclinic.org</u>). 3. Follow recommendations such as adding more fiber to your diet and maintaining a healthy weight. 4. Get screened! Talk to your primary care provider about your options for screening.
