Won't You Be A Neighbor?

First United Methodist church, established in 1869 has served as a catalyst in the Fort Collins community for 150 years. To honor this legacy of service in our community, FUMC is spearheading a collaborative investment in our neighborhood through the improvement of Eastside Park. The park, located to the northeast of FUMC and adjacent to Laurel Elementary School, needs revitalization to transform the area into a safe and meaningful community space. In its current state, the park draws negative activity as it lacks the infrastructure, lighting, and aesthetics to positively engage the community. Laurel School and businesses surrounding the park have been put on lock-down several times over the years due to criminal activity in the park.

In February, a community meeting was held at our church to give neighbors the opportunity to prioritize improvements to this space. The City of Fort Collins responded by providing a concept plan to include:

- Landscaped Greenways
- Creation of a "great lawn," a welcoming open space for unstructured play and community gathering.
- Play features that are natural and distinctive from the adjacent bright, plastic school play yard.
- Natural rock climbing and wood balance for residents of all ages.
- Additional lighting to key park locations to increase overall safety.

The improved park, and our investment of intentional programming, will encourage positive activity bringing together this diverse community. FUMC is leading the fundraising effort to raise \$245,000 for the

improvements listed above and to provide programming in the park for 18 months. Financial support will be rallied from the community and from within the congregation to ensure Eastside Park remains collective investment. We hope to have funds raised by October 2019, and construction will begin in the spring of 2020.



Adult Faith Formation

Dr. Melanie Rosa will lead a four-part study on Tuesdays in July on the new book from Richard Rohr, one of the world's most influential spiritual thinkers. The Universal Christ: How a Forgotten Reality Can Change Everything We See, Hope for, and Believe, is scheduled for noon in the Parlor on July 9, 16, 23 and 30.

Drawing on scripture, history, and spiritual practice, Rohr articulates a transformative view of Jesus Christ as a portrait of God's constant, unfolding work in the world. "God loves things by becoming them," he writes, and Jesus' life was meant to declare that humanity has never been separate from God—except by its own negative choice. When we recover this fundamental truth, faith becomes less about proving Jesus was God and more about learning to recognize the Creator's presence all around us and in everyone we meet.

Thought-provoking, practical, and full of deep hope and vision, The Universal Christ is a landmark book, and an invitation to contemplate how God liberates and loves all that is.





Mission u Co-sponsored by Mountain Sky Conference & Community Engagement

The History of the Columbarium by Barbara Hagen

The Columbarium began with a group of interested church members meeting in December, 2005. Warren Mauk was named chairman. In March 2006, the Task Force selected the grassy area outside the office wing of the current church for the Columbarium. The committee visited Columbaria in Northern Colorado and chose Eickhof Columbaria to construct a curving wall of niches.

A presentation was given to the Administrative Council in October 2006, and a Charge Conference in December 2006 approved the project. In May 2007 the

Board of Trustees agreed to a contract with Sinnett builders as contractors.

The Task Force members selected three large slabs of red sandstone in Lyons, Colorado for the Remembrance Walls, at a cost of \$4627. This included the cost of engraving and shaping them to resemble mountains. Another Charge Conference approved more funding in August 2007. A generous donation from Don and Marlene Kelly solved the funding issue.

Construction began October 2007, and the Columbarium was dedicated April 20, 2008, as the remains of David Kelly were placed in his niche. The garden area is named for David, son of Mr. and Mrs. Kelly.

This service initiated the Columbarium Ministry for First United Methodist Church, Fort Collins, Colorado.
