Sanctuary Choir to Tour Austria in June of 2020



Update on the UMC

The Traditional Plan for the United Methodist Church takes effect January, 2020, meaning that the denomination will be doubling down on opposition to LGBTQ clergy and those who perform same sex marriages. However, the Western Jurisdiction (of which the Mountain Sky Conference is a part) will be a safe harbor for any clergy who perform a same-sex marriage and will welcome those LGBTQ people who are called into ministry and meet the qualifications for ministry. The 5 Bishops of the Western Jurisdiction publicly stated that they will not participate in any actions that put clergy at risk. They will not process any complaints against LGBTQ candidates or those who perform same sex weddings, stating: "We cannot abide by this evil any longer." This is unprecedented in Methodist church history; the first time an entire region has made such a pronouncement. We will certainly keep you posted as developments unfold in anticipation of General Conference in May, 2020. In the meantime, pray for our denomination.

A heart-felt THANK YOU to everyone who helped make our annual Holiday "David's Dinner" on the Pine Ridge Reservation a huge success! Once again we were able to supply the ingredients and preparation for over 150 turkey dinners with all the trimmings for residents on the poorest Indian Reservation in the United States. Three members of First United Methodist church went to Pine Ridge where we met the staff of the Pine Ridge

Reconciliation (formerly Retreat) Center, visited the Oglala Lakota College and Heritage Center, toured the Red Cloud Elementary and Secondary school campus in the village of Pine Ridge, viewed (and purchased!) beautiful hand crafts, art and jewelry -- all on our first full day! On Friday we rose with the sun and started preparing the turkey dinner, making use of practically every square inch of surface space in the center's kitchen! We served 50+ sit-down meals in the newly re-opened Lakota Presbyterian Church that shares the parking lot with the Reconciliation Center. We then prepared and sent over 100 meals out the door of the Center from 11am - 1pm. The Center will usually give out bologna sandwiches over the lunch hour, but the people who came to the door this Friday were surprised with a full hot meal – and the word spread fast! The weather was great, the landscape was beautiful and the people were wonderful. It was a blessing to be able to go and do, and it is all because of our generous congregation here at FUMC. Mitakuye Oyasin – we are ALL related!


You'll learn the value of family storytelling, how to find your own tales to tell, how to build a powerful story and how to create the right environment for storytelling.
