During this challenging year, your Restart Team has kept the health and safety of our congregation as our foremost priority. We have carefully considered what groups could meet at the church, what programs could resume, and when it would be safe to launch face to face worship. We affirm our decision not to resume in person worship for the foreseeable future, as difficult as that decision is for many of us. Last week Bishop Karen Oliveto notified the Mountain Sky Conference that all of the churches in our four state Conference should cease indoor worship immediately, through at least the end of January, 2021. Larimer County has implemented new COVID restrictions under an Emergency Public Health Order, transmission rates are higher than ever, and hospitals are exceeding capacity. We know this is difficult, especially heading into Advent and Christmas. We are hopeful that the recent promising news on vaccines will have us safely back together in 2021. Our church is engaged in meaningful ministry in so many ways during this challenging time. We ask for your continued patience and support as we navigate the greatest health crisis of a generation.
