KYLEN BEQUEST DISTRIBUTED

Longtime FUMC member, **Anne Kylen** passed away in 2021, leaving a bequest of \$110,000 to our church. Ms. Kylen received her master's degree at Colorado State University in Food Science and Human Nutrition and was a long-time educator. Her career included teaching high school home economics, teaching and doing research at the college level, and working for 22 years in the Department of Food Science and Human Nutrition at CSU, retiring in 1988.

Per FUMC's specific Policy for Managing Large Unrestricted Bequests, a working group of church leaders representing all areas of the church was assembled. This group discussed the needs of our church and the greater community, researched organizations, and determined how to best honor the legacy of Ms. Kylen. The final plan for the bequest received final approval by the Board of Trustees and the Church Council in May 2022.

The generous bequest was allocated as follows:

\$52,106 – Trustees General Fund (determined by a prescribed formula in policy)

\$20,000 – FUMC internal security project

\$ 5,000 – FUMC Youth Community Project

\$ 6,894 – UMCOR for Ukraine relief

\$5,000 - Coloradoans for the Common Good - Community Organizing Project

\$7,500 - Larimer County Food Bank to support FUMC Bookmobile

\$7,500 – Sproutin' Up Community Garden employing youth

\$ 6,000 - Faith Family Hospitality



COMMUNITY ORGANIZING By David Reid

First Church members and constituents are invited to observe a Delegates Assembly of Coloradans for the Common Good (CCG) 6:30-8 p.m. July 13 at Regis University in Denver.

CCG is an affiliate of the Industrial Areas Foundation (IAF), which has been building power organizations throughout the country for more than 80 years. The IAF builds organizations that are representative of the people in a given community and truly owned by that community.

Here are items expected to be on the agenda July 13:

- An invitation from CCG to form a new IAF affiliate in Larimer and Weld counties. This is the project that our church is spearheading.
- A report of several wins in the Colorado legislature such as a new law that prohibits school districts from incenting cafeteria workers to sell junk food to students;
- A discussion about how CCG can become more diverse, including introduction of some new faith communities;
- A discussion of an ambitious project to turn out the vote in key elections over the next two years and how we in Northern Colorado might participate




It is impossible to express the depth of my gratitude for all that you did to make my retirement celebration so special and memorable.
