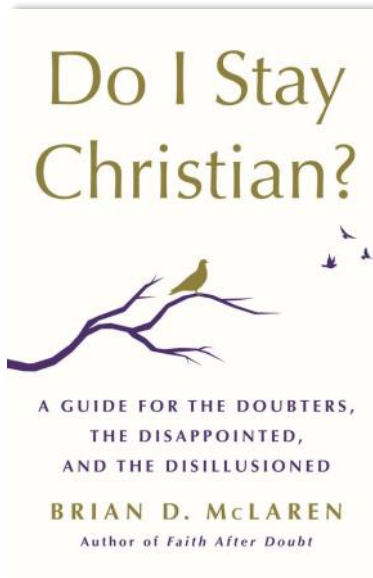

**"Do I Stay a Christian?" by Brian McLaren,  
Online 4 - session self-paced study in September,  
recommended by the Adult Faith Formation Committee.**

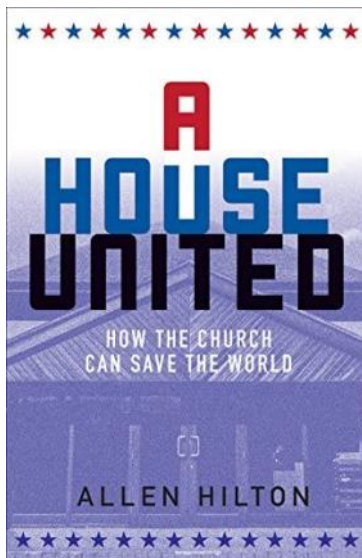


Join Brian McLaren and Tripp Fuller ("Homebrewed Christianity") as they lead an online community through four sessions with Brian McLaren's newest book. McLaren explores with honesty and humility the compelling reasons many people walk away from Christian faithing. He also gives suggestions toward a vision of Christian faithing that he and others find more liberating and life-giving.

This class operates asynchronously, so you can watch the McLaren/Fuller videos at any time that fits your own pace of reading the book. They will also host a live, real-time, Q&A discussion for four Sunday evenings starting September 11, 5:00 pm MDT. If a group from the church wanted to self-organize and gather together for those Q&A's, there could be some great discussion among them beyond the online work! (Contact Rev. Mark Lee and we'll arrange a meeting space.) The class is pay-as-you-like (even zero); the book can be bought from your favorite sellers. ### **Courageous Conversations Workshop**

**Saturday, September 17, 2022, 8:30am - 1:00pm (brunch included)**



Our world is fractured along lines of politics, class, race, religion, and nation, but many of us long for ways to reach across these divisions. As a followup to the 2022 Hagen Lecture presented in March, Rev. Dr. Allen Hilton is returning to First Church to help us reconnect with one another. This half-day workshop will teach us practical skills to enter into Courageous Conversations – generative discussions where we genuinely listen and engage across differences to heal division and transform the world. **Can I attend the workshop even if I didn't attend Dr. Hilton's lecture this spring?** Yes! Please do! This workshop will focus on skill building not covered during the lecture.

**Is there any pre-work for the workshop?** There is no required pre-work. We suggest reading Dr. Hilton's book *A House United: How the Church Can Save the World* to get some background on how we came to be so divided and why the church is called to heal divisions.

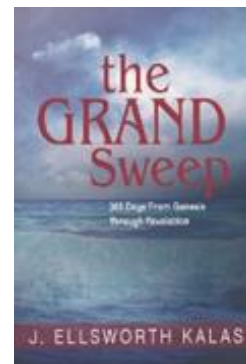
