

ANNOUNCING SUMMER SERMON SERIES: Christian Community

In <u>The Company of Strangers</u>, Quaker writer Parker Palmer wrote: "In true community, we will not choose our companions, for our choices are so often limited by self-serving motives. Instead, our companions will be given to us by grace. Often, they will be persons who will upset our settled view of self and world. In fact, we might define true community as that place where the person you least want to live with lives."



In these deeply divided times, the church of Jesus Christ has the opportunity to be something increasingly rare: a community of loving acceptance and diversity, with the capacity to transform individuals and culture. I have much to learn, but I do know that our church is situated in a vibrant University community filled with thoughtful, intelligent people committed to the common good. Moreover, we strive to be a faith community that lives out the Gospel of Jesus Christ, even – or perhaps, especially – when we struggle together with differing worldviews and opinions. New Pastor Begins with Food Drive For the Food Bank for Larimer County

Coinciding with her first sermon at our church on July 9, Pastor Melanie Rosa has asked that we, as a congregation, engage in a missional activity to support our local community. She and her Pastoral Passage Team, in coordination with our Community & World Outreach Committee, have chosen a special food drive in July for the Food Bank for Larimer County. Our entire congregation can participate in this effort, as we respond to a growing, year-round need in our own community.

From Sunday, July 9 - Sunday, July 30 we are requested to bring a variety of canned and packaged goods in original packaging to one of three drop-off locations at our church: NW corner of Fellowship Hall, east church door, or south church door. Our goal for the month is to collect 5000+ pounds of food for the Food Bank for Larimer County.

Through this food drive, Pastor Melanie inspires us to remember why we as a church exist – *to bless, heal, and transform the world around us.* This missional effort will be a wonderful way to welcome Pastor Melanie to Fort Collins and First United Methodist Church with a demonstration of our passion for mission.

Adult Faith Formation

David Reid, Director of Adult Faith Formation

First Church's small-group initiative is five months old and thriving. Here's a roundup of what has been happening.

- Theology on Tap is off to a great start, according to member Shan Watkins. The group has visited Wolverine Letterpress & Publick House, the Wild Boar Café, and Old Chicago. Topics have ranged from an open conversation with Pastor Vivian deftly fielding theological questions, to a lively conversation about Anglican theologian Alan Watts and his exploration of eastern meditation forms. Paul Pettinger, of New Belgium Brewery, provided a lesson on the proper technique of evaluating a beer along with a presentation on the Trappist Monks and how making beer fits into the monastic lifestyle. Lately, the group has enjoyed showing and discussing TED Talks.

 Theology on Tap meets on the fourth Monday at 6:30 p.m. Watch the bulletin or contact the church To find out where the group will meet next. No preparation or registration is necessary. Just show up and enjoy the conversation along with a pint of beer, a glass of wine, or a cup of tea.
- John Wesley's Class Meetings in a 21st Century Context: This group is exploring how to use communications technology to facilitate a small group experience that is rewarding for individuals whose schedules are exceptionally crowded. Contacts are Don and Eileen Gaymon.
- **Dinner for 8 (or 7 or 10)**: Several dining groups are meeting and each has adapted to changing needs of its members. One group of older adults meets regularly for lunch rather than dinner. Another group convened at the Chocolate Café after attending the Hagen Lecture. One group was formed with the idea of attracting people of wide variety of ages. An on-the-go group has plans for miniature golf followed by dinner and going to a Rockies game via Bustang.
- **Bread and Wine**: This small group may be looking for a new name. Facilitated by Jen Hanna, members just finished a study of *Bread and Wine* by Shauna Niequist and plan to keep going with a new study. Composed of younger couples (so far), the group meets on the last Friday of the month in members' homes. The church provides child care at the meeting place to support this effort.
- **Short-term groups:** Several short-term groups have already concluded and new ones are forming all the time. Short-term groups have included an **Introduction to Methodism** class on Sunday mornings and Pastor Cynthia's hugely successful **God's Welcome** class, which had more than 30 participants in five sections. A **Parenting Class** was offered on Wednesday nights.
- How to Start a Group: Adult Faith Formation has responsibility for encouraging and growing new small
 groups and helping people join existing groups. Anyone may start a group. Training to facilitate a small group is
 available as requested and is an essential component of forming a new group. For information or just to discuss

Danny and Sehar Bhatti will present a program on the culture of their native Pakistan Sunday morning, July 30.

The highlight will be a slide presentation at 11 a.m. in the Parlor. The country has four distinct regions and a variety of languages, climate and geography, including K2, the world's second-highest mountain. A rare Christian family from predominantly Muslim Pakistan, the Bhattis say they share many customs with the Muslims who were their neighbors.

Throughout the morning, they will offer for sale a variety of crafts from Pakistan, including jewelry, decorative boxes, men's caps, toys and other items. The items were shipped to Sehar by her sister to repay a personal loan. U.S. regulations make it nearly impossible to send cash to America from Pakistan, according to Danny, so the merchandise was sent as a substitute. Now the Bhattis are hoping to turn those items into cash.

Immigration rules have prevented the Bhattis from working for most of the two years they have been in the United States, but Danny began work as a banker in June.

The family includes their daughters, Cherry, 6, and Alessa, 3. Danny's parents, McArther and Riffat (Gloria), and their daughters, Arooj and Elishba, have been members of FUMC for several years.
