


Kick Off Sunday Is August 27 by Pastor Cynthia, Executive Pastor

Church Foundation Grant Awards 2017 – "Second Round" by Stephen Zink

Did you know that our church has its own Foundation which awards grant money for special needs of the church each year not funded in the annual budget? Since its founding in 1986, the Foundation Board has awarded more than \$325,000 in grant money to various church committees and groups. During the "Second Round", which ended on July 3rd, grant dollars totaling \$19,890 were awarded to the following recipients, among others:

- Trustees: Audio Video Booth Enclosure
- Trustees: Block Grant Various
- Preschool: Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Replacement
- ATRC: Network Storage Capacity Expansion
- ATRC: Network Rapid Recovery Capability
- Music Ministry: Future Concert Series
- Music Ministry: Conductor's Podium
- Adult Faith Formation: Portable Stage

Grant money is generated each year by the general fund of the Foundation. A formula preserves and grows the principle of the general fund of the Foundation so that it will continue to provide funds for new grants each year.

The FCFUMC Foundation is a separate 501 (c)(3) non-profit corporation. Donations to the Foundation are tax deductible, gratefully accepted, and are conservatively held and invested to support special needs of the church and its ministries. Donations can be made to the general fund which generates the annual grant awards or to the other restricted funds that the Foundation holds.

Our church is a member of the Fort Collins-Loveland Area Interfaith Council and has been represented there for many years. IFC includes representatives not only of faith communities, but also of local nonprofit social service organizations in this area. We meet each month to network, hear from speakers about social issues such as health, aging, parenting, and advocacy for those who have few resources. The programs are exciting, insightful, informative, and engaging – as are the people who attend!

In addition to facilitating a dialogue to bridge differences, IFC is a conduit for faith communities and agencies to provide grants to worthy entities. Money for grants comes from faith community members of IFC. In 2017, \$11,000 was distributed to applicants for program assistance. Iin effect, this congregation's support of local services and the work of the Community and World Outreach Committee is extended through the IFC, which connects many of the area's service organizations.

Receiving much-needed supplemental funds this year were the Boys and Girls Clubs, ChildSafe Colorado, Crossroads Safehouse, Dance Express, Disabled Resource Services, Elderhaus, La Familia, Food Bank, Kids at Heart, Colorado Health Network, Project Self-Sufficiency, Teaching Tree, and Voices Carry Child Advocacy Center.

ATRC Committee Update by Chuck Andre

Seen any great video presentations lately? All one would have had to do is attend one of the Sunday church services in the Sanctuary or a small group meeting in the Fellowship Hall. On display (pun intended) have been some of the newly installed video components from a recent upgrade. Those include new high def projectors and ultra-bright screens, confidence monitors for the clergy and choir in the Sanctuary, and 70 inch flat panel displays in the Fellowship Hall. Behind all of the visible components lies a state-of-the-art video control system, extremely complex in its componentry but very simple to operate.

Imagine being able to easily select from 6 different video sources and direct each one to a different monitor, or mix and match. We can do that. Imagine having different video sources on the two screens in the Sanctuary while being replicated in the Fellowship hall. We can do that. Imagine having the ability to view a presenter's PowerPoint on one screen and a video clip on the other screen. We can do that. The list goes on and on, including the ability to project a speaker's laptop screen from the front of the Sanctuary wirelessly to the projectors overhead, and displaying music and words on portable monitors for the Children's Choir while the audience views the group on the big screens. None of this would have been possible without two very important elements. The first is the fact that the ATRC committee gratefully received a portion of the extremely generous Makenin bequest. This was earmarked for video upgrades to both the Sanctuary and the Fellowship Hall. The second, and equally important element was the incredible and tireless effort of a group of dedicated church volunteers. They provided countless hours of labor to prepare for and facilitate the installation of the myriad of high tech components used by the contractor. Without their help, this project would simply have not have been possible.

We are just scratching the surface in terms of our AV capabilities. The new video equipment coupled with our state-of-the-art audio system will allow us to do things we could only dream of just a few months ago.
