Time to renew engagement with your library.

The Northern Colorado Faith Library may have appeared quiet during the worst of the pandemic but catalogers were hard at work, books were being delivered and we had time to think creatively. Now that doors are open again, the library looks livelier and more than 50 items were placed in circulation during the first three weeks of June.

One underutilized feature of the online catalog is the opportunity to post reviews for any of the 6,000 books, audiobooks, DVDs, and Blu-ray Discs in the library. Will you help us improve the library by posting at least one review? Here's how to do it:

1. Go to the [home page](#).
2. From the dropdown menu, select the title [The Art of Racing in the Rain](#) by Garth Stein.
3. On the record for that book, find these words in small green type "[Be the first to submit a comment & rating](#)." Click on that link, write a sentence, a few sentences, or a few paragraphs. Give it a star rating, put your name in the space for "Student" and hit "Submit." We will review your submission and post it.

If you want to find the whole list of books that have been reviewed, go to the home page, find the long horizontal blue bar and select "[Reader Review](#)" in gold type. Click on that for the list. Of course, it would be wonderful to have multiple reviews of any holding – especially if there's disagreement!

It's summertime and events are slim. Thus, a smaller *Beet* this month.

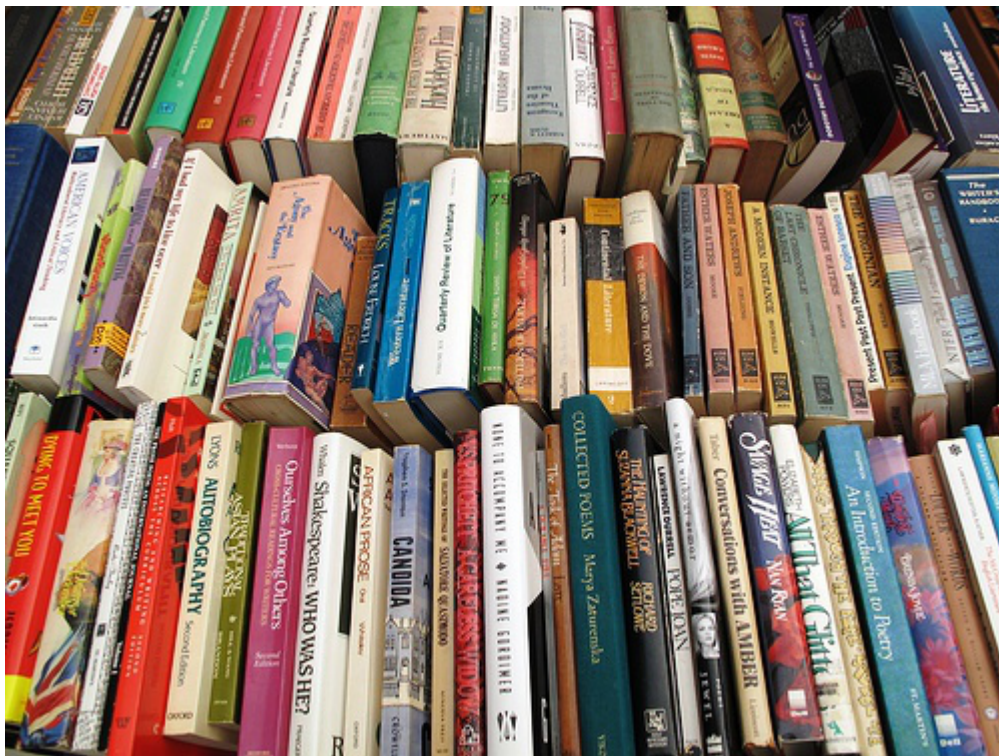

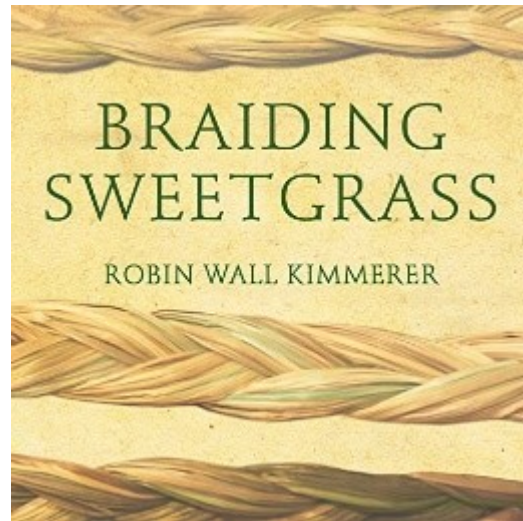
Funds raised through the sale will buy new books, audiobooks, DVDs, Blu-ray Discs, and equipment.

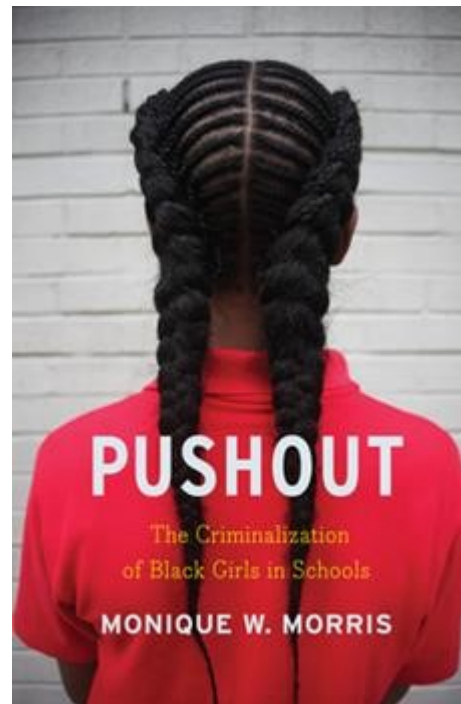

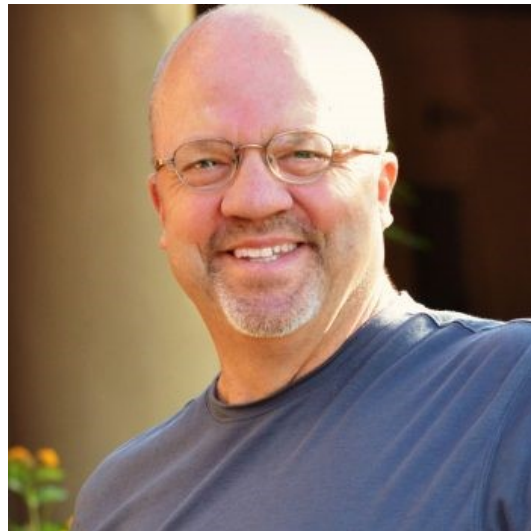
Pastor Melanie Martin-Dent will lead a four-session **Mission u virtual study** that uses Monique Morris'
